

Heart to Heart....

A moment of history in the Diocese

On Sunday 17th December, our parish made a decission to officially adopt *Collaborative Ministry* as the basis of its ministry and mission. It came about as a result of a vote that was taken on that Sunday following seven weeks of teaching on the biblical nature of mission and ministry. The voting was 90% in favour with the other 10% unconvinced that this was the way we should go.

Collaborative Ministry is a form of ministry and mission that is based on the discovery and exercising of the gifts (spiritual and natural) of all members of our congregations. The role of the Rector will be primarily to oversee the training and equipping of the members of the congregations for mission and ministry.

Basically not a great deal will change in our parish, because this has been the way the parish has been developing over the past thirteen years. However, such a decision will help us to be more focused in our planning.

Six other parishes have adopted this as the basis for their ministry, but what is significant (and historical) for us, is that we are the first financially viable parish to adopt this form of ministry. All the other parishes are not able to afford a Rector.

So what happens next?

Can you say what spiritual gift(s) God has placed into your life? Can you say what area of ministry that you believe God has called you to participate in?

This will be the next stage of development in the parish – the identification and matching of the gifts with what we believe (through prayer and fasting) are the ministries that God is calling us to engage in.

In doing so, we need to be keep in mind the following principles

outlined by Roland Allen:

- 1. Every congregation has within its own membership sufficient gifts to carry out its mission in tire world. (Note that sufficient does not mean all)
- 2. Every Christian Community should have handed over to it the Bible, the Creed, the Ministry and the Sacraments.
- 3. The Community is responsible for recognising the spiritual gifts and the needs of its members, and for calling forth those ministries.
- 4. The Christian community will share its message and its life with the neighouring communities not yet evangelised.
- 5. The Holy Spirit, working on the human endowments of the community leaders, is sufficient for its life. Don't train them too much. Don't import them from outside.
- 6. The Christian community
- 7. The bishop and his staff are crucial in this process
- 8 Any Christian community that can't do these things is not a church; it's a mission field.

In 1912, Roland Allen, and Anglican missionary in China, wrote a book that questioned the way in which the church was carrying out its mission. In his book Missionary Methods - St Paul's or Ours? he set out the basic principle of local collaborative ministry.

So the year 2001 looks as if it is going to be adventurous, interesting and very exciting!
