On behalf of the Parish Council, Bishop John and the organisers of the National Church Life Survey, a sincere thank you is extended to you for participating in the survey.

To ensure that confidentiality was preserved, no one in the parish was permitted to read the recorded information - including the Rector. This has been complied with.

In early 2001, we will receive a report showing the profiles of the two congregations in our parish. As more information is compiled from surveys across Australia, along with information from the National Census, more information will be distributed in due time which will keep us informed about trends that are emerging in the National Church.

TEN THINGS THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE ...

Over the next months there will be sheets placed in the ECHO and each church in the parish under the general heading "TEN THINGS THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE". This is a summary of information gathered from the last National Church Life Survey.

1. Discover a sense of vision and direction

Growing congregations are more likely to have a clear vision, goals or direction for the future.

Growing congregations have a large number of attenders committed to the vision.

Congregations that are growing or attracting newcomers:

- put a lot of prayer into direction setting.
- evaluate their progress
- take into account the local community in which they are placed.

2. Focus on those beyond the church

A congregation that's solely focused on regular attenders is less likely to grow than one focused on people beyond church life.

Congregations where leaders main role is seen as being the conduct of worship and pastoral care are less likely to be growing than those where the leaders role is seen as reaching the unchurched.

Growing congregations tend to have a large number of attenders who place value on outreach to the unchurched or wider community care as part of their church involvement.

In Anglican churches most attenders place most emphasis on worship and nurture than on outreach

The church must foster an outward focus and build better connections with those on the edges of congregational life.

Growing churches listen carefully to people on the 'edges' who are drifting in

or out.

Growing churches tap the experience and views of newcomers.
