

TEN THINGS THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE ...

This is the last article of a series under the heading of TEN THINGS THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE from the last National Church life Survey.

9. Move people towards commitment

Growing churches help members towards a deeper commitment to Christ and Christian service.

Growing churches tend to have people who feel they have experienced a moment of decisive faith commitment in their lives.

10. Create new congregations and new services

Growing churches tend to create 'new wineskins'.

For example, it has been found that it is usually better to leave an existing congregation to continue its life uninterrupted and develop new initiatives separately.

New initiatives would include developing new congregations, worship services and groups.

Congregations which have commenced services for non-churchgoers have higher levels of newcomers. Amalgamated congregations are usually less likely to be effective in drawing newcomers.
