# EQUIPPING THE SAINTS ... For Worship

### HANDS UP

In the first line of the famous hymn of Martin Rinkart are the words, 'Now thank we all our God with hearts and hands and voices'. This seventeenth century author regards our hands as a part of our anatomy which should be active in worship and he wasn't thinking of our holding a prayer book or a hymn book! The lifting up of hands in worship is as old as the bible. In Psalm 63.4 we read, 'I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name I will lift up my hands'. In Psalm 134.2 the Psalmist writes 'lift up your hands in the sanctuary and praise the Lord'. Paul says the same thing about prayer in 1 Timothy 2.8 'I want men everywhere to lift up holy hands in prayer'. There is evidence that this predominantly Jewish practice continued to be normal in the Christian Church for several centuries. St Augustine of Hippo wrote a short homily on Psalm 63.4 encouraging Christians to raise their hands in prayer because 'our Lord raised his hands for us on the cross'. To raise one's hands is universally to declare 'I surrender', and as such it is a meaningful gesture.

The practice can also be inferred from one of the most basic Hebrew words for 'worship'- yadah. This means 'to proclaim, to testify, to worship with extended hands'. There is an alternative but similar posture which symbolises silent adoration. The outstretched hands are lowered until they are parallel to the ground with our elbows tucked into our side. This has been called the deisis posture beloved of Russian icons. It is as if one is receiving a baby into one's arms.

But the open hands express something else. They are in marked contrast to the clenched fist sign of armed revolution. Christians in worship open themselves to the Lord. Open hands symbolise the readiness to receive anything - a new call to arduous service, the operating of charismatic gifts or crucifixion itself. Paul sums this up in Romans 12.1, 'I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God, which is your spiritual warship'. True worship implies self-sacrifice, without which the outward postures and gestures are meaningless. It is such worshippers for whom Jesus said the Father was searching (John 4.23).
