LETTER FROM REV. J. L. GOLDSWORTHY

Dear Friends,

For the next five weeks, St. John's will be without a Rector. This fact, I am sure, will cause us to look back with some regret as we think of the treasured associations we have had with Archdeacon and Mrs. Sutton. It will also cause us to look forward with expectation to the coming of the new Rector and his family. Many are wondering what he will be like. Some hope for big changes; some hope there will be little or no change in the life of St. John's. Two things, at least, are certain: Mr. and Mrs. Jerrim will come to us as people (to quote St. Paul) "of like passions with you;" they will need our friendship, fellowship and help; secondly, changes are inevitable. No two people

are cast in the same mould; Mr. Jerrim will come to St. John's with new insights, new ideas and a different background of experience. The changes will be either positive or negative depending on whether Mr. Jerrim has our co-operation and support, or not.

In the meantime, we are faced with five weeks of challenge. With the clerical staff reduced in size and experience, the successful continuance of the life of St. John's will depend more than ever on the lay people.

Sunday, 8th October will be a day of particular challenge to some fifty young people as they present themselves for Confirmation by Bishop Barrett. These fifty were first enlisted as potential soldiers of Jesus Christ in their Baptism, when they were signed with the sign of the Cross "in token that hereafter (they) shall not be asnamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified and manfully to fight under His banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto (their) life's end.

At their Confirmation, these young folk will take personal responsibility for the At their Confirmation, these young folk will take personal responsibility for the significance of that cross once signed on them, and personally ratify the promises made on their behalf by their God-parents. To promise to "renounce the devil and all his works," to "believe all the articles of the Christian faith" and to "keep God's holy will and commandments and walk in the same all the days of your life" is to promise what is humanly impossible. This is why the Catechism insists on the need to call for God's special grace by diligent prayer. It is why the Confirmation Service centres on the work of the Holy Spirit in the individual Christian. "Not by might nor by power, but my my Spirit, saith the Lord."

We do not fill up with a lifetime supply of God's special grace when the Bishop places his hands upon us in Confirmation. The victorious soldier of Christ maintains his "supply" of God's grace only by diligent attention to the Means of Grace—the daily Quiet Time for personal Bible Study and Prayer is vital in this regard as is regular and frequent attendance at the Lord's Table and other services Sunday by Sunday.

By the time this paper is issued, Archdeacon Sutton will have been inducted to his new parish of Evandale. With him and Mrs. Sutton there goes the sincere desire of every member of St. John's that God will greatly bless their life and ministry at Evandale. It has been decided by the Vestry that the official farewell to Archdeacon and Mrs. Sutton will take place after Evening Service on Sunday, 29th October. The Archdeacon will be the Preacher at that Service. The new Rector will be inducted and welcomed two days later on Tuesday evening, 31st October and will begin his ministry on Sunday, 5th November.
