## THE RECTOR WRITES

Dear Parishioners,

Trinity Sunday, 5th June, marked the 25th Anniversary of my ordination to the Priesthood. It was a very happy day especially as it commenced with many of you sharing with me in thanksgiving at the 8 a.m. service of Holy Communion and staying on to breakfast in the Parish Centre.

And what a Parish Family it was at breakfast, not many short of one hundred adults and children sat down to cereal, sausage and tomato.

For me it will be an occasion I will not forget and I thank you all sincerely for the presentation of twelve volumes of "The New International Commentary on the New Testament" which Mr. Max Easter made on your behalf — one volume during the 8 a.m. service and the others at the breakfast. Your fellowship, prayers and the Commentaries will be a continuing strength to my ministry.

At any Christian conference these days we can be fairly certain to find something about the Church's ministry on the Agenda. The character of the task we face in this latter end of the 20th Century is naturally shaped by the character of society itself. Because of this we hear of new patterns of ministry emerging and we are not quite sure what we should think about them. If we accept them, will we rock the boat or even sink the ship?

We can understand the idea of Hospital Chaplains or Industrial Chaplains even if, in the case of the latter, we don't quite know what they are supposed to do. But what of Team Ministry? Or of Frontier Ministry?

At the Clergy Conference in May I met the Revd. Jim Punton who is a Presbyterian Minister and Education and Training Officer of Scripture Union's Frontier Youth Trust in the United Kingdom. Jim Punton has exercised an exciting but somewhat untraditional ministry in Scottish slum areas and inner-city London. He also crossed the Atlantic to work in Harlem where his ministry led him out into situations from which most of us would hide because we do not understand them. Jim went out into these situations and struggling with them sought to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to broken lives. In this frontier ministry many social problems and corruption in the community were faced with loving Christian concern and dynamic action.

If we sincerely endeavour to understand the new patterns of ministry the boat will neither rock or will the ship sink. Sometimes working with or alongside traditional forms of ministry, sometimes carefully replacing them, new patterns may well provide under God the Holy Spirit the impetus needed for the renewal of the Church.


Incidentally, ministry is not only clerical or ordained. Our consideration of patterns of ministry, old or new, must include the ministry of the laity if it is based on the New Testament as it should be.

Because of my 25th Anniversary, I have been doing much prayerful thinking about the pattern of my ministry.

Have you ever thought out the pattern of your ministry?
