THE RECTOR WRITES

Dear Parishioners,

"If David has his way, God will be in vogue again." So reads a headline of 'The Australian' of 31st May, 1980. Another headline reads, "David's a Goliath among Gospellers." The article introduces readers to the Rev'd David Watson of St. Michael-le-Belfrey, York, U.K., who has had a remarkable ministry at St. Michael's and throughout the United Kingdom.

David Watson and a team from his parish will be in Launceston on Tuesday, 7th October, to lead a Festival of Praise at the T.C.A.E. Theatre at 7.30 p.m. If their recent experience at the Albert Hall in London is any indication you will need to be there early to get a seat — they packed the Albert Hall three nights running!

Music, drama, dance and preaching are used by the team to present a festival of praise centred on evangelism, renewal and unity.

God has uniquely blessed their work wherever they have been and Launceston will be no exception. This will be even more so if you pray for the blessing of the Holy Spirit upon the Festival of Praise. Come with your family, your friends and your neighbours; invite them all to be there. An invitation warmly and sincerely given may prove to be a step in "helping" someone to a new or renewed faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

David Watson says of himself, "I'm really quite orthodox. All I do is bring the same old message that Christians have been telling for just on 2000 years." With the team he does this in a way that makes it relevant to today's people.

At Synod in September much time was spent discussing and amending Diocesan legislation dealing with the running of parishes. Several previous Acts of Synod were repealed to make way for a consolidation of them with modifications designed to make things a little less complex.

The new Ordinance passed by Synod and assented to by the Bishop of the Diocese now becomes the guidelines for the administration of parishes. As soon as it is printed it will be widely distributed to enable Clergy, Churchwardens and Vestrymen to become familiar with its requirements so that we can begin to implement them.

Of significance to you all is the clearer statement to be signed by those who are the "Electors" of the parish, i.e. those who have the right to vote at the Annual General Meeting or other General Meetings in the Parish. Previously the statement could be signed by anyone over 18 years of age declaring themselves to be "a member of the Church of England and a worshipper in the parish." In the new Ordinance the requirement is that such a person also declare that they have been baptized. The declaration will now read "I am a baptized member of the Church of England in Australia, etc."

To serve as Synodsmen, Patronage Council Representatives, Churchwardens and Vestrymen, parishioners must be adult communicants of the parish except, in the case of Churchwardens and Vestrymen where "there are less than three qualified communicants eligible and willing to accept office" in which case "adult non-communicant electors may be appointed."

I have outlined these provisions to open a window into "The Parish Administration Ordinance 1980" at two points directly affecting decision making and office bearing within the congregation. I hope parishioners will want to know much more about this Ordinance as it begins to order our actions as a parish.

It is important that we realise the trust we must bear as God's people. Some think that administrative matters cloud the clearer spiritual prerogatives of the Gospel. However, to be faithful stewards of God's provision for his work we must see that this provision is administered efficiently and well. When we accept the spiritual nature of stewardship, administration ceases to be merely business associated with finance or property and becomes caring for the affairs of the Lord's Family.
