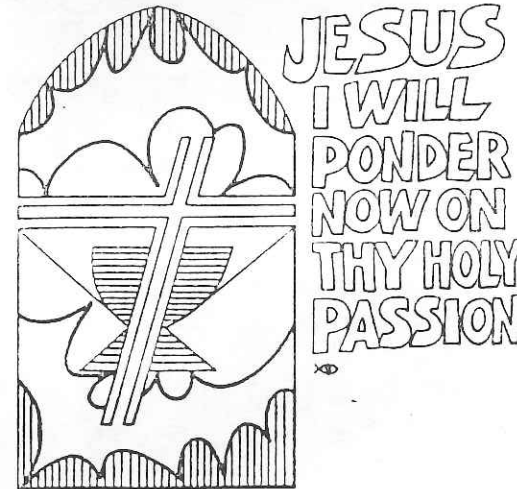

As a visitor I find it a great encouragement to see how so many people work extremely hard to maintain such things as the gardens, the Sunday breakfasts, the cups of tea after services, the linen and the buildings.
