

Australians have a number of similar lines as part of
their vocabulary, from the inane "Send 'er down,
Huey" at the outbreak of rain, to the more
direct "God help me!" and all its variations. Do they
have any meaning? In fact, they express, however
unintentionally, one of mankind's most essential
yearnings, the desire to know God.

Christians need to have an opinion about the religions of the world, more so in an age where many religions have begun to argue "equal rights" in a secularised society. How do you answer the claim that "one religion is as good as another"? In a sense, they are as good, and as bad, as each other. Each is an expression of mankind's desire to know God. They express in their various forms, God as creator, God as provider, God as the prime mover of nature and listory, but each in a clouded and insufficient way, the more primitive among them dominated by glaring inconsistencies, especially polytheism in its various forms in which gods are not all powerful, and are local in their influence, perhaps as the god of one tribe only, or of one mation.

At worst, religion deteriorates to "pay back", a kind of insurance against the wrath of the gods or evil spirits, or elitism whereby a priestly caste profits from traditions which establish it as the only means of access to the protection and blessing of the gods, sometimes at crippling expense to the faithful. Both these elements have crept back into Christian religion at various points of history.

The greatest of religions, characterised by the accumulated wisdom of millenia, achieve worthy, but still often inconsistent, rules for living, again accompanied by either ruthless legalism or ineffective ritual, sometimes to hopelessly inanimate statues. So the Christian may say, "yes, the religions of the world seek the true God, but they do not know God." And in truth, mankind can only know that there must be a God, but falls short of the knowledge that grows from relationship.

"...and the Word became flesh, and dwelt among full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father." (John 1:14) This is God's answer to religion! This is epiphany; God has manifested himself to us. Everything we need to know about God, his unrequited love for us, his forgiveness, his patience and forebearance, his provision, his coming judgement, we can know through the person of Jesus Christ, God and man. And more! We can approach the throne of grace with confidence by his promises, "for all the promises of God find their 'yes' in him." (2 Cor. 1:20) The greatest consolation of Christianity is that now our knowledge about God becomes relationship with God, through Jesus Christ. Can we refuse that relationship?

"OUR WORSHIP IN MUSIC"

A JOINT LETTER HAS BEEN SENT IN REPLY TO MR BILL PIERCE'S COMMENTS IN THE NOVEMBER ISSUE.

"IN RESPONSE TO THIS ARTICLE WE WISH TO PRESENT A CASE FOR CONTEMPORARY CHRISTIAN MUSIC. IN COLLATING THIS RESPONSE WE HAVE AIMED TO PUT FORWORD OUR VIEWS IN A LOVING CHRISTIAN WAY AND DO NOT WISH TO CAUSE OFFENCE TO ANY MEMBER OF THE CONGREGATION.

STUDYING THE SCRIPTURES, EPHESIANS 5: 19, 20 [NIV] SEEMS APPROPRIATE; "SPEAK TO ONE ANOTHER WITH PSALMS, HYMNS AND SPIRITUAL SONGS, SING AND MAKE MUSIC IN YOUR HEART TO THE LORD, ALWAYS GIVING THANKS TO GOD THE FATHER FOR EVERYTHING IN THIS NAME OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST."

OUR INTERPRETATION OF THIS PIECE OF SCRIPTURE IS THAT NOT ONLY ARE PSALMS AND HYMNS ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF WORSHIP, BUT ALSO THAT SPIRITUAL SONGS; CONTEMPORARY CHRISTIAN SONGS ARE ALSO ACCEPTABLE IN GOD'S SIGHT.

THE POINT OF WORSHIP IS TO GIVE THANKS AND PRAISE TO GOD AND THIS SHOULD BE FOREMOST IN OUR MINDS DURING WORSHIP, NOT STRUGGLING WITH AN UNFAMILIAR STYLE OF MUSIC. WE FEEL THAT GOD WANTS US TO BE CHRISTIANS FIRST AND ANGLICANS SECOND AND AS SUCH SHOULD BE DEVELOPING SPIRITUALLY.

AS YOUNG CHRISTIANS WE FEEL THAT THE SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT OF YOUTH WITHIN THE ANGLICAN CHURCH REQUIRES CONTEMPORARY CHRISTIAN MUSIC. TODAY'S YOUNG PEOPLE ARE SEARCHING FOR AN IDENTITY WHICH IS OFTEN FOUND THROUGH CONTEMPORARY MUSIC. AS CHRISTIANS, WE SHOULD BE ENCOURAGING YOUNG PEOPLE TO FIND THEIR IDENTITY IN CONTEMPORARY CHRISTIAN RATHER THAN SECULAR MUSIC.

MOST YOUNG PEOPLE LAND POSESS MR PIERCE'S VAST KNOWLEDGE OR BACKGROUND IN TRADITIONAL MUSIC AND AS SUCH IT IS UNREALISTIC TO EXPECT THEM TO APPRECIATE TRADITIONAL MUSIC IN THE SAME AY AS MR PIERCE.

WE UNDERSTAND THERE EXISTS A GREAT VARIETY OF PEOPLE AT ST JOHN'S AND THE SPRIRTUAL NEEDS OF THIS DIVERSITY ARE MET IN A COMPLEXITY OF WAYS."

"IF ST JOHN'S IS TO BE EFFECTIVE IN OUTREACH, IT NEEDS TO OFFER VARYING STYLES OF WORSHIP TO MEET THE NEEDS OF BOTH THE CHURCHED AND THE UNCHURCHED.

TO A NEWCOMER AND ALSO TO YOUNG PEOPLE, TRADITIONAL HYMNS AND SUNG PSALMS ARE OFTEN TOTALLY FOREIGN, AND NO IDENTIFICATION CAN BE FOUND WITH MODERN-DAY MUSIC. THIS RESULTS IN A FEELING OF ALIENATION, HINDERING ANY FURTHUR DEVELOPMENT TOWARDS A CHRISTIAN BELIEF. BY INCORPORATING A BALANCE OF TRADITIONAL HYMNS, PSALMS AND CONTEMPORARY MUSIC, THE NEEDS OF THE UNCHURCHED, THE YOUTH AND THE CHURCHED WILL BE MET.

CONTEMPORARY CHRISTIAN MUSIC {AS SUNG AT SOUNDS OF PRAISE SERVICES} IS NOT IN OUR OPINION, TRITE, AND THE "INANE REPETITIONS" OFTEN SERVE TO REINFORCE IMPORTANT ASPECTS OF WORSHIP WHICH WE FIND BOTH MEANINGFUL AND SPIRITUALLY UPLIFTING.

IN CLOSING WE WISH TO QUOTE EPHESIANS 5: 21 [NIV] "SUBMIT TO TO ONE ANOTHER OUT OF REVERENCE FOR CHRIST." CONCESSIONS MUST BE MADE TO CREATE A BALANCED MUSICAL WORSHIP, INCLUDING BOTH TRADITIONAL AND CONTEMPORARY STYLES AS BOTH HAVE THEIR PLACE IN THE WORSHIP OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST."




