Mission is proclaining the Gospel, living out the Gospel and relating the Gospel to society as a whole.

It is the responsibility of every individual, every parish and every diocese; and it matters not where we live, we all belong to the Body of Christ.

The Partners in Mission programme will encourage us to look again at ourselves, to be more effective and to plan for th Future.

The Parish Action Group is writing a profile of life at 5t John's as we see it - our strengths, weaknesses, things to be improved and plans for action. WARREN AND DI FUREY

Our Friends From Perth W.A. are preparing theaselves to serve the Lord in Guinea Bissau, Vest AFrica. God Lhea called For ai ssi onaru service, through their home church, the Perth International Christian Centre. Both graduated From the M. T. C. Tasmania. Their next step will be language study in Portugal at the Coimbra University for which they leave Australia in September, 1991. Marren and Di are aiming to work amongst the Fulani people, which is a W.E.C. targeted Unreached People group.

<u>The Fula people</u>. Population: 180,000 in Guinea Bissau, 20% of the population centred on Bafata, 300,000 in Senegal and 70,000 in Gambia.

Language: Fula Forro with five dialects in Guinea Bissau. Literacy: Unknown. Bible Translation: No Scriupture, no translation in progress.

Religion: Islamized with a small Roman Catholic minority, from Portuguese colonial influence. There are very few believers. Missionary Activity: Several W.E.C. missionaries have worked in the Bafata area and since 1985 a Balanta congregation has evolved. Several Fula converts live in close villages, but there is no worker specifically for the Fula people.

Warren and Di need your prayers. They need wisdom in the use of their time in Perth. They need guidance in all they do before they reach West Africa.

The Fula people need your prayers also as they come to know Christ in Guinea Bissau.

MINISTRY TODAY

For "...clericalism lingers, iŁ appeals not only to clergy but to some lay persons as well. It is a tempting attitude for laity who want to be passive, either because they find security in having an ownicompetent oracle or because they do not want to accept the responsibilities oF Christian life implied by their baptism. A living body requires the living participation of all its aeabers. So too does the body of Christ.

Ministry is the activity of the entire body of Christ. Each person has a special ministry, shaped to fit the given reality of that person's life. Ministry is not the enactment of a predatermined pattern of action. A individual or a parish or a diocest may be called upon to minister in unexpected ways, since ministry is always a response to a unique situation.

shi ch way in Ministry 15 а individuals or communities respond to the persons or situations in which they Find theaselves, in obedience to the command proclaimed in the liturgy: to love others as Christ loved them. Ministry is not to another person at another time. It is here and now. It is not what we would do if we had greater resources or if the situation were somehow different. Ministry is what is done with existing resources in existing circuastances in obedience to Christ the Lord. IF the person wh crosses our path is hungry and ou responce is 'I would Feed you if I had more bread' then we have failed to minister in the name of Christ." (Fram "Liturgy Far Living" by C.P.
