



"JESUS" – a video produced by John Heyman, no date, 2 hours, price \$48. A Genesis Project production, distributed by Here's Life Ministries.

Advertised as a faithful re-creation of the life of Christ as chronicled in the New Testament Gospel of Luke, "JESUS" is well produced and well filmed, accurate in detail, even down to the colour of Jesus' eyes.*

"JESUS" was filmed entirely on location in the Holy Land, which gives it a sense of realism.

In some ways it is a bit slow and pedantic in its actions and on several occasions the sound and picture are out of synchronization, the dubbing is poor in places. Inevitably, the film must be compared with Zeffirelli's "Jesus of Nazareth" which also follows Luke's Gospel and which is also available on Video. Heyman's film is shorter and less expensive, Zeffirelli's is more inclusive and forceful. Most Christians would have seen Zeffirelli's film when it was shown at the Launceston cinema a few years ago.

The object of the film is to bring the Good News into the homes of people everywhere. It has been translated into 165 languages and has been successfully produced to facilitate achieving such an objective.

The cost of \$48 is very reasonable. The accompanying manual is naive, but would be suitable for new Christians and those seekers just outside the faith.

Overall, the film is an excellent evangelism tool. It is recommended that every St John's parishioner view this film to have a personal appreciation of its impact and then pray about how to use such a tool outside the church.

St John's now has a copy so please enquire at the Parish Office for borrowing arrangements.


