Ross reported that problems with the St Oswald's alterations had been sorted and work would restart soon.

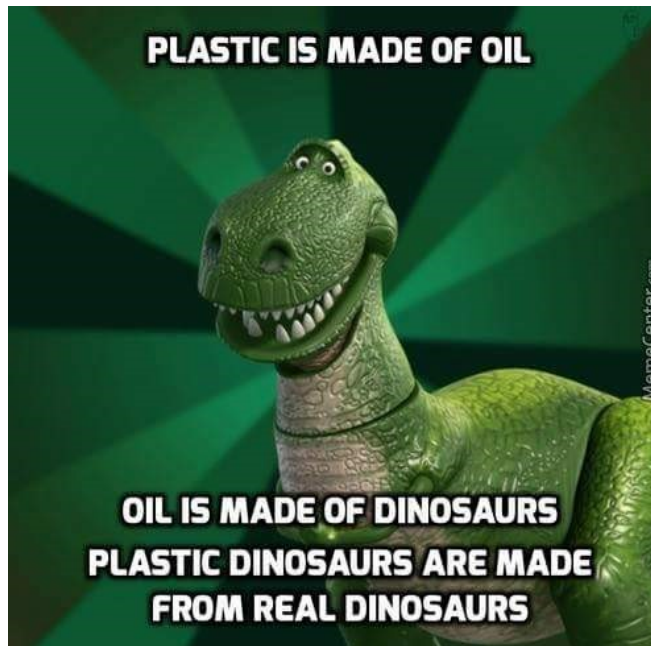
Some interesting recipes were exchanged.
