## FROM THE ENABLER

For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your forefathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect.

1 Peter 1:18-19 NIV

Last week I attended a preaching conference at Sydney Missionary & Bible College. Don Carson was one of the main speakers for the conference. He will be speaking at the next CMS Summerview conference in Port Sorrell and I recommend that you plan to go and hear him. Something he said last week really struck me. How would you finish this sentence on what the church is here for?

'The church of Jesus Christ is about ...'

Last week in Sydney Don Carson finished the sentence like this:

'The church of Jesus Christ is about preparing people for eternity.'

I already knew that but I was struck by the words he used. They are crystal clear and helpfully succinct. Are you as clear on what your church is about? Do you possess a degree of conviction about that? Do you sense the import of those words and that calling? Let me unpack them with you:

'The church of Jesus Christ' The church, the gathered people of God, is a gathering and people that is owned by Jesus Christ. It is his church, for which he suffered and died and rose (Rev 5:6-10; 1 Pet 1:18-19. He owns it and it belongs to him.

'...is about preparing people' For what? Don Carson went on to say, 'not for happy marriages. They are a side-effect, and in the light of eternity, very secondary.' You wouldn't think that judging by the focus of so many churches today, as if our chief calling is to prepare people for a successful life, marriage, career.

'...for eternity.' That is the New Testament's perspective and focus. Is it yours, your church's? We are here, principally, to proclaim God's gospel by which his people are saved for all eternity and by which they are sustained in their salvation (Matt 28:18-20; 1 Cor 1:18);

to love and serve and teach and admonish one another that we would grow into the likeness of Jesus and live for his glory (Eph 4:11-16; 2 Cor 3:18). Of course we serve our communities (Titus 3:1-3,8,14) and seek to be light and salt in them (Matt 5:13-16); and of course the gospel and Spirit will make us better married partners, parents and employees (Eph 5:21-33; 6:1-9); but that is not our message or focus, Instead, our chief concern is to be preparing Jesus' bride for her big day, when she (the church) is presented to Him 'in splendour, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish' (Eph 5:27; cf. Rev 19:1-10); that she/we would enjoy and serve and alorify him in the New Creation forever (Rev 5:6-14; 21 & 22). What a calling we have now, what a future then!

So

The main thing is that the main thing remains the main thing – in Pipers River, Trevallyn, East Launceston, Hillwood, Riverside, Low Head and George Town.

Please be working together with your Ministry Support Team and Parish Council in the high calling of preparing the church of Jesus Christ for eternity; the work of mission to your community and ministry to the church. Here are some upcoming opportunities for training and ministry in the service of Jesus and his church:

~ 'Invest': diocesan training day for all Anglicans; to equip and encourage you in future life and ministry – 4th August at Launceston Church Grammar School, Mowbray Heights. More details in this newsletter. Bible teaching, electives including evangelism strategies, community outreach, parenting, children and family ministry, readers and worship leaders, youth ministry, seniors' ministry. There really ought to be lots of people from Riverlinks at this day. Your time and training will be an investment in eternity.



The offer was made to St John's to participate, and they contributed with a Power Point of the Parish with helpers. They also contributed some hand-crafted wooden ornaments with Christian messages to give away. As some people insisted on making a donation any money received was given to Mission Afloat.

Our activities were made up with bible verses which Anne put onto fridge magnets and cards, and colouring & activity sheets for kids. Children's Christian DVDs were played in conjunction with the computer and projector.



Josie Ford came with the Samaritan's Purse boxes and we received encouraging support State wide. An advertising DVD about Samaritan's Purse was played on a small TV.

Chairs were available for mothers with young children and older people. The set up was simple and basic due to not knowing what to expect. Plenty of ideas have developed from the venture and I have been encouraged from the positive comments given by those who worked on the stall.

My deepest thanks to all who helped, and experienced working outside their comfort zone. Working with the Mission Afloat group was very successful and our confidence grew by Saturday to agree that we should make it a 3 year project. A committee is needed to put Agfest Riverlinks together for 2008.






She now plans to return to Pakistan as a CMS member with prayer support (a CMS Associate). She is going at the invitation of the local church.



# CREATING COMMUNITY BY ARCHIE POULOS

Almost every survey of a church's vitality has "the sense of community" as a measurement criterion. This is just a reflection of the way we all feel that God and His people are big on relationship, and so our churches should have relationship at the centre.

Half a century ago the creation of community was not an issue for churches. We did not have cars and regional shopping centres, and schools our children attended were not half way across the city from each other. We lived in our suburbs, saw each other not just at church but at the shops, in the playground, at sport and walking the streets. Church life did not have to create community church relationships were part of the community.

The problem is not just that the pace of life in our cities is increasing exponentially. There are so many different activities we commit ourselves to, and they are done in so many different places. Life has become a series of events and tasks rather than relationships, and we are unlikely to engage in those activities with people from our church in any case. So we have to work in order to create the church community.

The list of possibilities is as long as our urgent "to do" lists - ensure mornina tea or supper are the best they can be, church picnics and breakfasts, mid week prayer groups, men's dinners, women's activities, social activities. Sometimes, we so clog the diary that congregation members feel guilty they cannot attend, or just raise their hands in despair at the impossibility and wind up not caring when the next activity is advertised. So we must ask ourselves, if relationship in community is what we are seeking, what is the best way of achieving this?

The best way to get even is to forget.

Feed your faith
and your
doubts will
starve to death.

God wants spiritual fruit, not religious nuts.

It seems to me that the development of valuable relationships occurs a number of ways.

These include:

- an extended period of relationship, so that you share many experiences
- dealing with and support through significant issues and events
- putting the other first
- spending time with each other, not with an agenda, but merely because we want to be together
- sharing life in a variety of contexts

In our churches one of the ways of putting the first and last of these together is by seeing others over an extended period of time in both church and smaller situations where we mutter the gospel to each other.

That is, the old habit of being involved in both church and Bible study. This variety of context makes for deeper relationships, and Bible study, because of its very nature allows for inefficient time which builds relationship.

I guess I am asking us to consider the question "do we program so many community building times that we don't have time for the bread and butter of participation in both church and Bible study?" Sure, these two are unlikely to make us feel like we are a small village community, but it will help us employ God's gift of each other as we walk toward glory.
