

training in your home group. I consider it significant that around half the members of the parish spent seven or more weeks really coming to grips with what the biblical gospel is, and with a simple, effective way to share it with others. My constant prayer has been for the people of Riverlinks to know and be gripped by the gospel and moved to share it courageously with family, friends, neighbours, work colleagues. Why do you think that is?

Because, firstly, there is one God, the Creator and Redeemer of all people, and all people therefore owe him their loyalty, love and lives - to his glory and praise (Ps 96; Acts 17:16-31); Secondly, because in the resurrection and glorification of Jesus, God invested all authority in his Son, who now embodies the reign of God over the seen and unseen world - Jesus is Lord (Rom 10:8-12; Acts 17:30-31; Phil 2:5-11); thirdly, because those who persist with their God-substitutes (= themselves, their families, their work, their obsessions,

let the fields be jubilant, and everything in them. Then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy; they will sing before the Lord, for he comes. he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in riahteousness and the peoples in his truth.

the love of money, false gods and religions) and don't serve Jesus as Lord, will suffer God's eternal punishment, something Jesus spoke more about and grimly warned against more than he spoke of heaven (2 Thess 1:5-10; Rev 6:12-17; 20:11-15); fourthly, because in the perfect life and substitutionary sacrifice of his Son, God has made it possible for rebels and idolaters to be made right with God now, and escape his wrath on Judgment Day (Rom 3:21-26; 5:1-11; Rev 7; Jn 5:19-29); fifthly, because the Lord Jesus commanded and commissioned his Church to proclaim the gospel and make disciples of all nations (Matt 28:16-20; Lk 24:44-49); sixthly, because through the proclamation of the gospel and repentance towards God and faith in Christ, the Lord Jesus gives people the Holy Spirit, who makes spiritually dead people alive to God and to eternity (Jn 5:24-25; Titus 3:4-7), adopts them into his family as his children, making them co-heirs with Christ of the future Kingdom and New Creation (Rom 8:12-17), delivers them from the dread and fear of death and judgment (Heb 2:14-15), gives them a place and a purpose in his Church (1 Cor 12), and the will and the way to live as his people: loving God, loving his people, loving their neighbour (Phil 2:12-13; Gal 5:16-6:10), becoming better husbands, wives, parents, children, employers, employees (Eph 5:22-6:9), and bringing good news and blessing to the world (Matt 5:13-16; 1 Pet 2:11-17) - all to the glory and praise of God (Eph 1:6, 12, 14).

What more reason do we want or need to be serious about knowing God in Christ and making Jesus known in word and deed? How serious are you about this? How serious is your congregation about this?

What is your congregation doing about the lost people all around it? Not to mention the lonely and needy people all around it? Let me ask this another way: what are you and your congregation giving yourself to? Here's a way to gauge the value of what you and your congregation are living for.

Ask yourself, is it helping prepare me and others for eternity - the glorious future which God sent his Son to secure? Are we living in light of and for this future? These are searching questions that must be faced by all of us regularly, lest we drift into distracted, de-railed lives.

On a related subject, have you looked at the Riverlinks website to see the Certificate in Theology and Ministry that Riverlinks is administering on behalf of the Diocese? This is a program of significant learning for all Anglicans, and especially those in any form of leadership in the local church - preachers, home group leaders, MST members. It is an important part of Bishop John's vision to see all Anglicans becoming mature disciples of the Lord Jesus. Have a look at www.riverlinks.net.au or ask Anne Godman for a copy of the prospectus.

I plan to recommend to the Ministry Support Team that in 2009 the home groups follow up the Two Ways to Live training with training in answering common questions and objections about Christianity. This will strengthen our own faith and our resolve to defend and promote it wisely, graciously and compellingly. If you're not in one of our many home groups in the parish, you're missing out and so are they. If you are in one, don't let it become safe and predictable. Be ever looking for new members, devote your group one term a year to outreach, another to training, be accountable to one another, love one another.

In your home groups and congregations, I urge you to stop at nothing in becoming

PARISH ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

This year's Annual Meeting was held at George Town and was very well attended with 58 present and 16 apologies recorded.

Churchwardens:

Tom Nixon [George Town]; David Sutton [Trevallyn & Riverside]; and Mark Ford [East Launceston].

Parish Council:

Brian Baxter and Greg Clark [GT]; Garth Tevelein and Bill Raynor [EL]; Ken Pedley and Ian Morley [T/R]. In addition Jo Tevelein is the Ordained Local Minister appointment to Parish Council, Stephen Janes the MST appointment and Mike Le Rossignol appointed in his position as Co-ordinator of Administration.

Parish Mission representative:

Mary Bonnily was appointed to this position.

Giving to Mission:

It was decided to give en per cent of offertory to nominated missions during the twelve month period. This will be an amount of \$15,000 if our budget reaches its target.

Parish Budget:

This year our budget for offertory has risen slightly to \$150,000 [\$12,500 per month]. Last year we came very close to reaching our budget figure of \$144,000 as \$142,342 was raised. Congratulations everyone - the challenge before us is to now reach, and if possible exceed our new budget.

Many thanks to the people of George Town for their wonderful hospitality on the occasion of our annual meeting.

Micah 6:8 MSG The main objective of Stand Up and Take Action is to raise awareness and get people from all over the world, all ages and all beliefs - you! - to take action towards the complete eradication of poverty and for the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

Last year, over 43 million people Stood Up to demand that world leaders keep their promises to end poverty and inequality. This year, help us break that record and send an even louder message to our governments. Join the global movement of people who refuse to stay seated or silent in the face of poverty and broken promises to end it! STAND UP and TAKE ACTION against Poverty and for the Millennium Development Goals.

Why Stand Up? In 2000, leaders of 189 countries signed the Millennium Declaration agreeing to do everything in their power to end poverty. They pledged to do this by achieving the Millennium Development Goals, a roadmap to end extreme poverty by 2015.
