

# **From Roger**

Dear Friends,



Compact though this quaint church is, and considering the not inconsiderable community commentary we are facing at the moment, it never the less seemed a fitting place and time to reflect on the nature of spiritual warfare. In our passage from the final chapter of Ephesians set as

the Epistle of the day, we are told to put on the whole armour of God, for we are not fighting human beings. It is much easier to fight human beings but the scripture points to the real source of opposition to the work of the church. Paul explains that we are not wrestling against flesh and blood but against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms (Ephesians 6.12). Indeed we are wrestling in precisely the place where we have been placed in Christ. Remember chapter one, our reading seven weeks ago, it tells us that we are seated with Christ in the Heavenly realms (Eph. 1:3).

Paul then goes on to encourage us to put on the full armour of God, so that when the day of evil comes, we may be able to stand our ground (Eph.6.13). The belt, the breastplate, the shoes, the shield, and the helmet, are all to enable us to remain

safe under attack. Only the sword has a potential attacking capability. I want only to mention one element of the armour here, that of the shield.

At the moment the Anglican Church in Tasmania is facing many "flaming arrows of the evil one" (Eph.6.16).



Commentators agree the reference to the shield of extinguishing faith fierv certainly arrows almost refers to the Roman soldier's shield that was covered with very soft wood, fiery arrows that plunged into the wood went out. So all the flaming arrows of the evil one fires can be absorbed by our shield of faith. And our faith is in the One who is our Truth, our Righteousness, our Peace and has given us His Spirit. We may have been meeting in a small building last Sunday, but we were worshipping a big God.

# The simple trick for better relationships that most people ignore



So I was catching up with a friend the other week and I was really excited to share some news with him.

Now we've all been there. We have something exciting to share and want to tell others so that they can get excited too and support us, just like we support them when it's the other way round.

So I told my friend this news, but sadly, he reacted differently to how I thought he would. He decided to explain why he would never make the same decision as me, in great detail.

### We've All Been There

We've all had this happen to us haven't we? Where we feel like we haven't been listened to and come away from a conversation feeling rubbish.

I totally believe that sometimes we need to be challenged. We need people close to us to tell us like it is, we do not just want them to always agree. But we need to be listened to as well. We need people to really hear what we are saying and make us feel valued.

A genuine, relationship-building conversation involves two people really listening and allowing each other to express themselves. When it's just all about them, you leave feeling rubbish. (Assuming of course, there isn't a crisis that they need to talk about in-depth).

#### We've All Done It

But then I started to worry about the times I had done that, or got carried away myself. Taking over all of the space and conversation and not really stopping to listen.

I think I can end up doing it, especially when I'm tired or it has been a long day. I find it much harder to listen. To be fully present. I felt bad about

the times when I recently forgot to really hear what others were saying and made other people feel like they weren't listened to.

We can all make mistakes can't we? And get it wrong. But when we forget to really take in what our friend, or our other half, or the other person is saying, the relationship is weakened when we make it about 'me' rather than 'us'.

### Just Stop

I remember ages and ages ago during a talk, someone saying: 'The next time you are talking to someone, just stop talking, and really listen. Because people have a lot to say, and they need to be heard.'

This has always stuck with me. Especially in a society that tells us that to be worth something we need to be the centre of attention, need to be the 'most unique person' that everyone is talking about. But investing in the relationship is what will answer our deepest need, rather than just focusing on ourselves.

All of this stuff you probably know already. You've probably heard it before. But it's so easy to forget, to just want to talk, to get carried away.

#### Imagine If...

Imagine if we remember this simple but powerful idea. That we don't just sit there in silence during a 'conversation' waiting to talk again. But intentionally listened and really took on board what people were saying. That they went away feeling listened too. When we forget this simple trick, it makes our relationships weaker.

For some people, this will be hard, for others it will be harder, but loving people and building relationships starts by valuing the other person and what they have to say.

## From the trenches

"Some mornings I wake up & wonder where I am!"

This year David has had numerous trips across the region. Sometimes he wakes up clueless about where he is and what he's doing there! Happily it all dawns on him within a couple of seconds. There have been road trips Emmaville-Deepwater to (Northern NSW), Baradine (North West NSW); Tenterfield, Armidale, Coffs Harbour, Woolgoolga, and NSW); Grafton (Northern Dalby-Jandowae (Darling Downs region, QLD), Moranbah-Clermont-Emerald-Blackwater (Central QLD): Atherton (from Cairns), and flights to Cairns (Far North QLD) and Townsville (North Queensland).

While visiting the Collings family in the coal mining

town of Moronbah, David noticed that the street where the church and rectory are is named after the church. The church is named after St Francis, the 12<sup>th</sup>/13<sup>th</sup> century monk who lived a life of voluntary poverty, preaching and deep love for creation. This BCA-supported church proclaims in word and deed the gospel of our Lord Jesus: 'that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his might become poverty rich' (2 Corinthians 8:9).

It was thrilling to attend the church's mainly music program led by a talented and dedicated team and attended by about 15 unchurched families. Since David's visit, the church started having barbecues and Messy Church for mainly music and other unchurched families.

David also made the first BCA visit (he thinks) to St Mark's uneChurch, Armidale, speaking to around 600 people across three services. This church has committed to make BCA one of its mission

partners and to link with the Fergusons in South Tamworth.

One of the many blessings in David's role is to stay in the homes of local Christians, On this trip, it was a joy to stay with Howard & Heather Doran (and Charlie their border collie). David's showed how off the beaten track the road to their property was! BCA supporters like the Dorans are special people - warm and generous people who love Jesus, His Word, His church and His work in the bush through BCA. We thank God for them and for you.

BCA Nomads - a special breed

While in Emerald and Blackwater (Central QLD) to speak at a number of events and Sunday services, David & Julie had the joy of meeting Lesley Richards, a BCA Nomad and mother of the Anglican Rector in Emerald (The Revd Ien Hercott). Lesley is a gutsy, godly trooper for Jesus and the gospel. She sold her home in Tasmania to buy her new motorhome and, with the Lord's help and strength, plans to make many BCA Nomad trips.
